

Where to Camp in Logan, Utah

[Boasting more than 7000 upgraded campsites](#) and practically unlimited primitive camping opportunities, few states are able to compete with the myriad of camping prospects found in Utah. Camping in Utah will have the avid camper adventure into the pristine alpine wilderness or explore the isolated bare desert, where the beauty of the night skies will change your life forever. With so many camping choices at your disposal, one of the hardest decisions to make when camping in Utah is deciding where to go.

The easiest way to narrow down your selection is to determine what you want to do. Some areas, such as the Uinta-Wasatch-Cache National Forest, offer superb all-round activities such as fishing and canoeing (thanks to the glorious Logan River) as well as beautiful hiking paths and mountain bike trails. Next you need to determine what amenities you will need as they generally differ from campground to campground. Some campgrounds may, for example, not allow open pit fires but do allow you to [bring along your own ethanol fireplace](#). Decide whether you want to camp in relative luxury with hot showers and full utility hookups or you prefer to rough it without running water and toilets. Logan Canyon is home to a variety of campsites that cater for every type of camper out there.

Spring Hollow Campground

The Spring Hollow Campground is situated right next to the Logan River and is only 4 miles East of Logan in the scenic Logan Canyon. Visitors can enjoy an array of activities in nature ranging from fishing and canoeing to biking, hiking and animal tracking. The area is covered by maple, oak, cottonwood and box elder trees that provide ample shade as well as breathtaking fall colours. During summer, wild flowers and wild roses are in abundance, lending a beautiful colour profile to the area. [The Logan River flows right past](#) the campground and a large pond is located right at the campground's edge. The Spring Hollow Campground is made up of 2 large group sites that can accommodate up to 100 people with both being available for overnight camping. Spring Hollow is the perfect camping ground for families wanted to explore the great outdoors.

Guinavah Campground

Also situated in the Uinta-Wasatch-Cache National Forest, a mere 5km from Logan, you will find the Guinavah Campground surrounded by 75-year old black willow trees with the Logan River gently flowing through it. The river is ideal for tubing while numerous hiking and mountain biking trails crisscross the area surrounding the camp site. Guinavah contains numerous group sites that can also accommodate up to 100

people. A large amphitheater with bleacher seating is situated near one of the sites with flush toilets and drinking water being available to all campers.

Not only is camping fun for the whole family but it also provides the camper with a unique and holistic way to explore the [vast natural beauty Utah has to offer](#). Even if you have never camped before there is no reason to fret. There is ample information available online about where to go and what to take. All you need is a sense of adventure, basic camping gear and good company - the rest will all fall into place as your adventure unfolds.
